Welcome back, I hope you all had a lovely half term break. We have all been enjoying the little bit of extra sunshine and the slightly warmer weather this week.

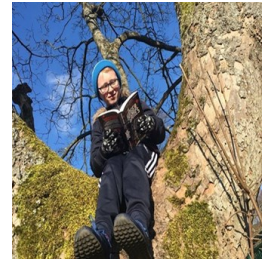
