Dear Parents and Carers,

It was lovely to see lot of children in green today as part of the PTFA Go Green mufti day. This links to the COP26 Convention and the work being done to work together for our planet. For over half-term I have made a suggested sheet of activities your child or you as family might like to explore (as an attachment and on google classroom). They are only suggestions but any work you can share and bring in would be fabulous. We shall be looking at this a little more in the first week back after half term too.

On Tuesday and Wednesday night we held Virtual Parents evening. Lots of great conversations have been had between parents and teachers. If you did not manage to access the appointment, then please do email class teachers who will arrange a mutually convenient time to meet you to discuss progress in Autumn Term 1.

This week we were due to have the Y3/4 Bible service where Year 3 are presented with a Bible to use at school in KS2. Unfortunately, the Bibles did not arrive as they were held up so this is rearranged for the 2nd November. If any child in KS2 has a Bible that they have had presented previously it would be brilliant to have it returned to school so they can use them specifically in RE lessons but at other times too.

This week in Collective Worship we concluded our work on Compassion and thought about two stories of coming to the rescue. We also reflected on how we have demonstrated compassion this term and how this can continue and what we more we can do.

After half term we will be marking Remembrance in school with KS2 attending a service at Church and KS1/EYFS having one in school. Poppies and items will be on sale after half term. I have attached the dates for Term 2 again today – with everything we are aware of happening – there may well be more! This includes a couple of PTFA events too.

We have had a number of children being tested for Covid at this time. Whilst we are still extremely lucky that we have had very few cases it is also important to remember that currently guidance states that if there are NO symptoms then children can be at school until a Positive PCR is received. If symptomatic on the other hand, they cannot return unless a negative PCR has come through. It is also now not a school's responsibility to say who should or should not be tested. That is down to Track and Trace and also you as parents who know whether your child has had close contact with a positive case. This of course may well change and as I mentioned at the start of the year additional measures may well need to return too.
