Curriculum & Learning update Yr 5 & 6

Year 5/6 have been busy this term learning about Ancient Egypt. We have studied the Gods and created fact files about these. We have looked at the construction of the pyramids and the importance of these to Egyptian life. We designed our own death masks and created clay scarab beetles. We are looking forward to painting these after half term.

In science we have been busy testing materials and conducting experiments investigating dissolving, changes and permeability. We have enjoyed learning handball in PE and Herons have made fantastic progress with their swimming. Kingfishers have been doing Outdoor and Adventurous activities. The children have created some incredible mystery story writing in English using the images of Harris Burdick as inspiration. In RE we have been looking at forgiveness and the concept of what Heaven is like, creating our own detailed images.
