#### **Consultation on Draft Admission Policy for September 2025**

We are currently consulting on our Admission Policy for September 2025. There are two changes within this policy; a change to our admission criteria to bring us in line with other ODBE schools, and there is a reduction in our Pupil Admission Number (PAN) to 30 from 45. This is due to a reduced population in the catchment area.

The consultation requires a minimum six-week consultation period, in line with the School Admission Code. The consultation period is from Wednesday 8th November to Wednesday 20th December 2023. #### **Curriculum & Learning update KS1**

KS1 are in full-swing with nativity rehearsals at the moment and are looking forward to performing for parents on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> December. If your child has a speaking part, please encourage them to continue practising their lines at home, particularly if they are a narrator! On Monday, we had a brilliant workshop on 'The Great Fires of London and Banbury' run by the Banbury museum. The children were able to compare their learning on the Great Fire of London to that of Banbury in 1628 and then complete a carousel of practical activities including guessing the mystery object and constructing their own towns with firebreaks. We were very impressed by how much knowledge they had retained from this term's topic. The children have also enjoyed expressing their creativity this week to create artwork based on the Creation Story for a whole-school RE display.
