## **Curriculum & Learning update Nursery & reception update**

It has been lovely to see all the children return to school after the half term. They have settled well, and all have shown enthusiasm in their learning and play this week.

We continued our theme of People Who Help Us with a visit from a local vet who spoke to the children about what a vet does. We met a pretend dog who wasn't well, and the children helped the vet carry out assessments to find out what was wrong. The children have had fun exploring and learning about things related to Autumn, such as leaves, pumpkins, hedgehogs and squirrels and we have talked together about what different animals do at this time of year to prepare for the winter season.

## **Attendance**

During the next week we will be monitoring attendance. We know that children who attend school regularly are more likely to have better outcomes. This includes arriving at school on time. Please ensure your child is at school by 8:50 each morning. The gates are closed at this time, and any child arriving after 8:50 is marked as late.

It is also really important, if your child is unwell, that you provide a reason for this. For example, a high temperature, stomach bug etc. Mrs Henderson in the school office, who completes the attendance registers, will follow up and ask for a reason for absence if none is provided.
