<p>Parent Toy Detective</p> <p>Ask a grown-up what their favourite toy was when they were little.</p> <p>Draw it or find a picture of one online and stick it in your book.</p>	<p>Design Your Dream Toy</p> <p>Draw or build a model (Lego, Play-Doh, boxes) of a brand-new toy you invent.</p> <p>Give it a fun name and superpower!</p>	<p>Build a Castle</p> <p>Make a castle using junk, biscuits, crackers, fruit, or Lego (your choice).</p> <p>Take a picture before you eat it or dismantle it!</p>
<p>Royal Job Swap</p> <p>Imagine you lived in a castle.</p> <p>What job would you want (e.g. king/queen, cook, knight, jester?)</p> <p>Draw yourself doing the job.</p>	<p>Create a Castle Pet</p> <p>Invent a pet that might live in a castle (dragon, mouse knight, unicorn).</p> <p>Draw it and write one sentence about what it does.</p>	<p>Design a Shield</p> <p>Create your own knight's shield.</p> <p>Add symbols that show things you like (pets, hobbies, colours).</p>
<p>Castle or Toy Themed Baking</p> <p>Help an adult make a simple food that might have been eaten in a castle, e.g. bread, vegetable soup, or honey cakes.</p>	<p>Castle Collage</p> <p>Make a castle collage using paper scraps, foil, fabric, pasta, cotton wool or anything you find at home. Try to include towers, a moat and a big gate!</p>	<p>Castle Fact Finder</p> <p>Choose a castle (like Windsor, Warwick or Edinburgh) and find 3 fun facts about it.</p> <p>Draw the castle and write your facts around it.</p>
